Rates of infant mortality in the US remains significantly higher than rates in "peer nations." In part, these high rates are due to high rates of infant mortality among blacks. Results from the proposed study will identify modifiable environmental factors to focus interventions in the policy environment, where they have the greatest potential to reduce rates of infant mortality and its undue burden on black infants.
