***Linking climate, air pollution and housing conditions to develop strategies to reduce racial disparities in infant mortality*** (12/15/2014 – 11/30/2015)

Rates of infant mortality in the US remains significantly higher than rates in “peer nations.” In part, these high rates are due to high rates of infant mortality among blacks. Despite declines in infant mortality among blacks and whites, disparities have widened over the last twenty years, and a significant portion of this disparity is attributable to infant mortality from respiratory distress. Results from the proposed study will identify modifiable environmental factors to focus interventions in the policy environment, where they have the greatest potential to reduce rates of infant mortality and its undue burden on black infants.
